DevData CSV downloads: explainer

DevData (<u>https://devdata.mfat.govt.nz/</u>) is a New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) website that enables users to explore up-to-date, detailed information on New Zealand's international development cooperation activities. Activity and transaction data can be downloaded into comma-separated values (CSV) files. CSV downloads are currently available for each country, regional area, and sector category¹.

The information on DevData primarily conforms to the International Aid Transparency Initiative (IATI) standard. The IATI standard draws heavily on codelists that are maintained by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development – Development Assistance Committee (OECD-DAC). This document provides information on the two types of CSV file available for download from DevData: <u>Activity</u> and <u>Transaction</u>.

Field/column heading	Explanation
last_updated_datetime	The date/time that the IATI data for this specific activity was last updated. This date/time changes when the value of any field related to that Activity is modified.
humanitarian	True or false to indicate whether the activity relates to humanitarian aid.
iati_identifier	A unique identifier for the activity. All activities have the prefix "NZ-1-ACT-"
title_narrative	A short title that contains a meaningful summary of the activity.
description_narrative	A longer description containing a meaningful summary of the activity.
implementing_partner_name	Partner organisations are the actors with whom New Zealand cooperates. Not all partners are currently listed.
activity_status_code_name	The stage the Activity was at when the data was extracted. Activities in design, implementation, or closing stages are active and activities in closed stage have been completed.
activity_date_planned_start	The date in which the activity was initially estimated to enter implementation stage.

recipient_country_name	The country or countries that will benefit from this activity. Activities can benefit more than one country (and more than one regional area).

transaction_expenditure_to_date_by_s ector	The total value of financial transactions against an activity during the activity's lifetime to date by sector. This is based on apportioning the identified sector_percentage against the transaction_expenditure_to_date_total.
